The Peerless here.

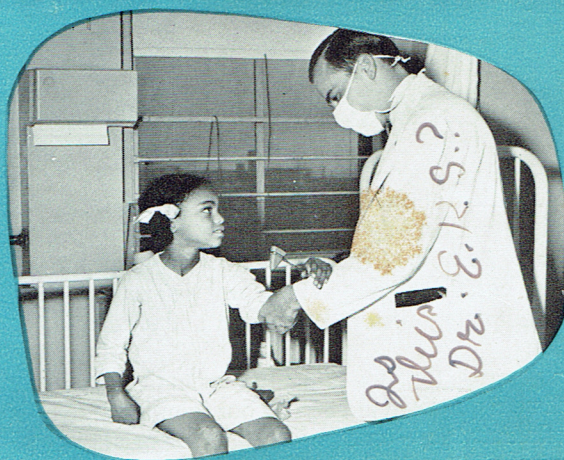

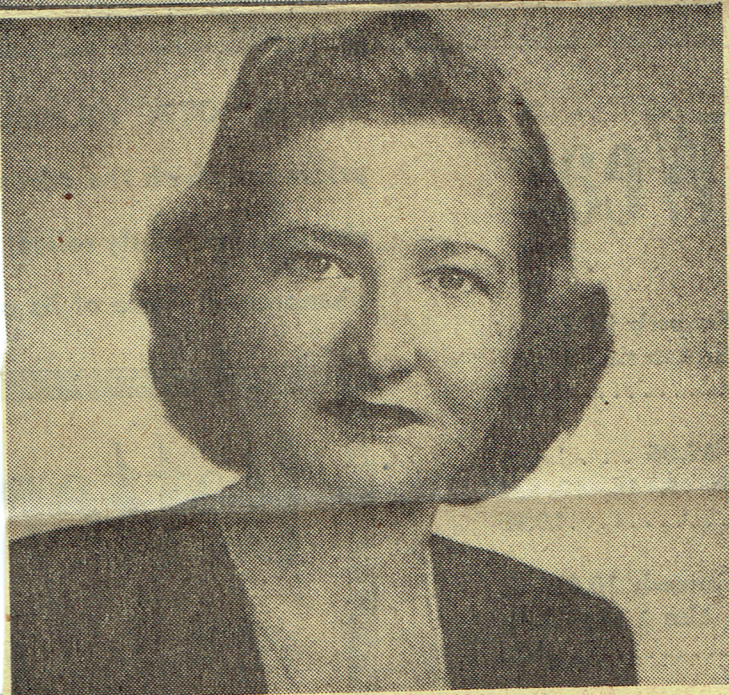
