Thursday - July 14 - 1950

Your letter asking us to come up for
dinner while Joan and Bob were here
was such a nice one, I have been wanting
to sit down and take my pen in hand
ever since to tell you all about the
things that have been happening here.
I'm sure, Emie has told you by now
about Jerry's getting sick even before Bob
got here. He was really very low for two
weeks, on the bed temp 102 - 103 - He
had been sick for awhile before he gave
up and it seems it will be some time
before he feels quite up to standard again.
He has this acute infectious mononucleosis
in his blood and it makes him very ex-
hausted all the time. He was to have gone
to work June 26th with Goodrich but
Dr. Weisman's report today was not very
encouraging - said he could work when
he feels able but it would be several
months before his strength would be back
to normal. Makes me think of Sandy just

when he was ready to work - Teach us to be patient, I guess.
